Tagaytay City Wins Dubai Cup, Shanghai 2nd and Wu Xi 3rd

The Tagaytay City team beat Shah Alam, Malaysia, 2½:1½ to clinch the title in the Asian Cities Chess Team Championship (Dubai Cup) in Tagaytay City, Philippines even as Malaysian Yeoh Li Tian upset GM Mark Paragua on board 2. Shanghai, China edged Sharjah, UAE 2½:1½ but UAE champion GM Salem A.R. Saleh played the best game of the tournament, a sacrificial attack against GM Zhou Jianchao to win the board 1 gold medal.

Wuxi outclassed the young Singapore team to tie Shanghai but finished in third place since they lost their direct encounter with their compatriot Chinese team. Tagaytay finished alone with 17 match points while Shanghai and Wu Xi tied at 15 match points each.

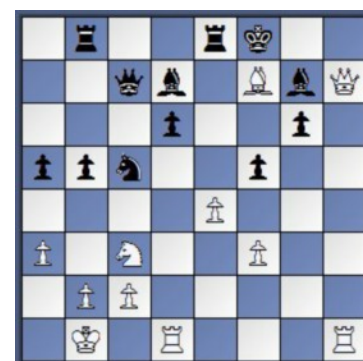
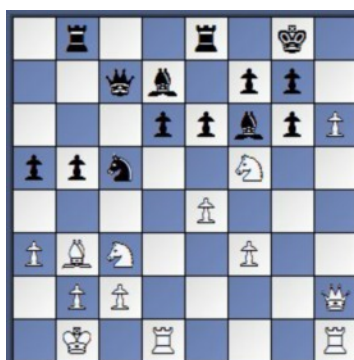
Ulaanbaatar won two individual golds and one bronze. Also winning board medals were Manila, Pasay and Baghdad.
