**Date:** 12 – 21 September 2024

**Type:** Swiss system, 9 rounds, standard FIDE rules, computer pairings (Swiss Manager)

**Time control:** 2 × 90 minutes + 30 sec per move.  
Waiting time: 30 minutes!

**Tie-break:** 1. Buchholz Cut 1, 2. Buchholz, 3. Berger-Sonneborn, 4. Progressive.

**Program:** Opening ceremony: 12 September 2024, 9:45  
Rounds at 10:00 every day from 12 to 21 September 2024, except for 17 September, which is a day off!  
Closing ceremony: 21 September 2024, 15:30

**Chief Arbiter:** Zsolt Korpics, International Arbiter

**Registration fee:** Above 2000 ELO: 12.000 HUF (30 EUR)  
Under 2000 ELO: 16.000 HUF (40 EUR)  
GM (WGM), IM (WIM) titleholders do not pay an entry fee.

**Registration details:** **Deadline – 8 September 8 2024.** It is also possible to register on the spot, before the competition, for a surcharge of 3000 HUF (8 EUR). Players may enter with a valid **FIDE ID number** and **Hungarian Playing License** (HPL – 8.000 HUF or 20 EUR/year) that can be paid on the spot, together with the entry fee. Maximum number of participants: 200 persons. **Players have to check in onsite:** Thursday, 12 September 2024, from 8 am to 9:30 am, before Round 1.

**Prices:** 1st place: 375 EUR + cup + medal  
2nd place: 300 EUR + medal  
3rd place: 250 EUR + medal  
4th place: 175 EUR  
5th place: 125 EUR  
Special prices: Best Senior/ Woman / U2000: 100–100 EUR

During the game, players may not have on them any electronic communication device (including smart watches), or any device capable of suggesting chess moves. If a player brings such a device to the Tournament Hall, (s)he has to keep it switched off and stored in a separate bag, which is not accessible for him/her, during the game, unless with the special permission of the arbiter.

In all cases that are not covered either by the rules or the competition regulations, the Organiser will decide before the start of the competition, and the Chief Arbiter after the start of the competition.

The organizers reserve the right to change the competition regulations.
