1. Chairman of Trainers Committee GM Yuri Razuvaev read list of present members of Trainers Committee. All absent members apologized (Sosonko, A. Kuzmin, Vladimirov, A. Petrosjan, Psakhis). New members were elected: **Zsuzsa Polgar** (Coordinator for the North America), **Xie Yun** (Coordinator for China), **Alonso Zapata** (Coordinator for Latin America), **Wladimir Schmidt**, **Boris Postovski**, **Tamas Georgadze**, Simen Agdestein (Norway), Fernando Braga (Italy), Reynaldo Vera (Cuba)

2. Chairman's report was accepted.

3. Report of Director of FIDE Trainers Academy Uwe Boensch was accepted.

4. There were two propositions for new system of trainers titles (one by Trainers Academy and another by Mr. Ignatius Leong). Mr. Leong proposition with five titles was accepted. Two titles will

be awarded by regional Academies (Developmental Instructor and National Instructor), three titles were already accepted by FIDE on the previous Congress (FIDE Instructor, FIDE Trainer and FIDE Senior Trainer).

There is one change in required qualifications for FIDE Trainer. He (she) is expected to speak one of FIDE official languages (before was just English).

All national federations will use accepted system of trainers titles and coordinate and incorporate own programmes in to FIDE programme.

All national federations are requested to propose their own list for candidates for FIDE Trainer titles. Committee will review the qualifications of proposed names and accepted candidates.

All accepted candidates will obtain titles after the national Federation will pay the specified fees.

5. Trainers Committee develops programmes for different levels and manuals for trainers.

We propose to FIDE to publish six manuals for different levels. For this purpose all the world top trainers will take part in the work.

It is urgent need to create modern programmes. Last programme was created in USSR, 30 years ago.

Manuals will be written first in English, then in other FIDE languages. The cost of one Manual is 30.000 USD.

6. Trainers Committee suggest to establish an official FIDE Training Center for young players in Slovenia. Slovenia is well known chess country, with his own very successful Training Center. They could offer different variety of additional activities (all kinds off sports), they could offer reasonable prices for accommodation. They have support of the Slovenian Government and national Chess Federation.

Trainers Committee unanimously supports establishing of FIDE Training Center in Slovenia.

7. Trainers Committee is convinced that is urgent need to conduct seminars for trainers during the World and Continental Youth Championships.

In this way we can minimize the costs for trainers participating in this seminars. Estimated Costs for such seminars will be 25.000 USD.

8. System of trainers education can be started after we have a group of World top experience trainers, which will be able to start programmes. For these reason we ask the Congress to award the title of FIDE Senior Trainer for this group of trainers, each of them can conduct trainers seminar.
