**DEAR FRIENDS,**

According to discussion in CACDEC meeting at October 23, I propose to include in CACDEC resolution for GA the following points:

1. to recommend to all national chess federations to make efforts for creating The CACDEC Education Centers (CEC) in own National Universities, if such Universities have already official chess curriculum and qualified chess tutors.

2. pick up two scholarships at \$ 3000 (hostel included) per student per year during four years for studying in CEC in Moscow - Russian State Social University (Chair of Pedagogics and School Chess Work) for chess players under 18 from former Soviet Union (as Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Kirgistan, Moldova, Armenia).
