



FIDE COMPUTER & INTERNET CHESS COMMITTEE REPORT

for the 76th FIDE Congress in Dresden (Germany), 17-24 August 2005

Activities:

- From January 2005 until present, members of our Committee have been engaged in a joint, practically daily project, with FIDE and the FIDE Trainers' Committee, headed by Grandmaster Yuri Razuvaev, in the Internet spreading of the major project of summarizing documents necessary for the successful applications of newly established FIDE Trainers' titles.

All major Internet websites, their editors and webmasters, chess magazines and other media have been approached via the Net, with the purpose of propagating the newest project of FIDE.

Most of these have been more than cooperative and helpful in spreading the news, publishing articles, comments, FIDE Trainer Academy reports, etc.

I can conclude that these activities proved very successful, improving chess communications and information access worldwide. Friendly websites, too many to mention all here, publishing relevant FIDE information have had an astonishingly high number of unique hits, along with many personal approvals and support of FIDE's newest project.
